The summer camps open up Emmaus to volunteers keen to give their time and enable them to enjoy a worth-while human experience. The camps are also a means of championing the movement's ideals to a broader public.

Our big sales are a chance for the Emmaus groups to meet up, chat and socialise, and offer a great showcase for the movement.

We know that the solidarity-based Europe of Emmaus really works, so let's continue to promote our initiatives and implement solidarity on a daily basis.

Financial support

The 2017 European solidarity programme approved by the Regional Council of Emmaus Europe on 18/2/17 contains eight initiatives run by six groups in four European countries. The approved projected budget for the programme was €211,968.

As of 31 December 2017:

- €137,856 of donations had been received from the European groups.
- €79,667 had been paid out to five groups for their initiatives run under the framework of the 2017 programme.
- Five initiatives were fully funded and were completed.
- Two initiatives were partially funded and are set to be implemented as of spring 2018.
- One initiative is pending. We are awaiting more clearly defined plans.

Two reminders about the solidarity programme were sent out in May and July 2017 to the European groups in order to receive and transfer on time the funding needed to roll out the initiatives before the summer began.

Italy – Emmaus Padua improves community living conditions

Emmaus Padua has undertaken conversion work in order to improve companion living conditions and increase the number of residential places available. The aim was to refurbish the dining room and rebuild one of the community's accommodation areas.

The group had to demolish one of the buildings before doing the groundworks and laying the flooring. A perimeter wall was built and the building was connected to the water and power supply.

The asbestos dining room roof was also replaced. The ceiling was repaired, improved heat insulation was fitted, and the building was rewired.



By doing this work, the group has made the premises safer for the community's companions.

This building work was the first phase of a larger redevelopment project. In the long term, the Padua group believes that this work will enable it to increase the number of places offered, in addition to improving the living conditions of existing residents.

Emmaus Europe and Emmaus Italy provided support for the building work.

Lithuania – The Missing Persons' Families Support Centre inaugurates its Green House

The MPFSC has undertaken major building work. The aim was to bring together the Emmaus charity shop, day centre for trafficking victims, and emergency accommodation in the same place.

The group has changed the ground floor window and has refurbished the interior of the ground floor (ceiling, walls and flooring).



Amount transferred by Emmaus Europe to this initiative: €27,128

The building now has three emergency rooms, a kitchen, two bathrooms, an office and the Emmaus charity shop.

The new premises were officially opened on 14 October 2017 with a



large number of official representatives attending the event, including representatives of the ministry of work and social security, the public prosecutor's office, the police and Vilnius council.

The group feels that the centre will benefit a large number of people by offering shelter and support to victims and people at risk of human trafficking and forced prostitution, and through the telephone helpline and training courses delivered.



Romania – Frères Europa wants to offer housing opportunities to young adults

Frères Europa's initiative seeks to address an internal and external issue. Firstly, the community can only house young people up to the age of 30. Furthermore, the legislative framework in Romania makes it very difficult for disadvantaged people to take out a mortgage and therefore buy a property.

Frères Europa wants to develop a micro-credit system to enable young community leavers to become home owners.



The group wants to start by building two houses, which will be bought over time by the young people, who will ultimately become homeowners. The scheme also enables them to live independently.



Repayments by the young people will enable the fund to be replenished and new houses to be built. The fund will therefore be self-sufficient.

At the present time, the group has a plot of land and the administrative formalities are underway to determine the regulatory requirements that will enable plans to be drawn up. The intention is to build the houses in 2018 with the help of the young people who will subsequently live in them.

Romania – Un coup de main d'Emmaus Iasi wants to open an educational farm



The lasi group has been developing a partnership with Emmaus Fribourg and a Swiss market garden for the past year. Members of the Romanian community regularly travel to Switzerland to receive market gardening and organic farming training.

The knowledge acquired will be put to good use in lasi on the group's various farms and particularly the Belvédère site. The group intends to turn the Belvédère site into an educational farm for local residents and students. They could visit the farm and spend several days working on it.

Amount transferred by Emmaus Europe to this initiative: €6,000

Amount still needed to complete the amount requested from Emmaus Europe: €28,060

The lasi group has already received a metal structure donated by Emmaus Ferrara. The structure will be used as a shop and warehouse. The intention is to erect the structure during a summer camp to be held from May to September 2018. Volunteers will be able to attend for varying periods of time to help with the construction, utilities connection work and the construction of two timber houses. Finally, preparations will be made to enable the group to launch the farm work with the help of an agronomist.

In the meantime, the lasi group is focusing on obtaining the last few permits, preparing the plan with the architect and in accordance with the regulations in force, and the groundworks.



Ukraine – Oselya mutual aid community is improving its sorting methods

Oselya mutual aid community is the first organisation to have installed clothing collection containers and now has 23 of them in Lviv. The group is continuing to work to achieve recognition as a key player in the circular economy in Ukraine and to secure the long-term future of its collection work.

However, the group is encountering a number of practical issues when attempting to collect and sort unwanted items. The group only has two very old trucks which they use to collect donations every day from all the containers. Furthermore, the warehouse is too small and does not provide proper sorting and storage space.



One of the group's projects is to purchase a new larger warehouse to



increase its sorting capacity.

The group hopes in particular to improve its sorting methods and that a larger proportion of the collected clothing can be put to good use.

In 2017, several Oselya representatives travelled to France to visit several groups and observe the methods in use. The group wants to improve its own practices and has already partially changed the way it operates following these visits.

The group is also starting to look for a plot of land for its warehouse and the next phase of the initiative hinges upon this property search.

Ukraine – Nasha Khata has its own water supply and is developing its farming activities

Just like in 2016, solidarity has enabled Nasha Khata to cover the wages of two leaders and an administrator.

This enables the group to carry out and develop its activities with greater peace of mind. The group is home to 32 companions who collect and sell second-hand goods, and also work on the farm.

The group has also developed its farming activity. Solidarity has enabled them to purchase the seeds they need and harvest roughly nine tonnes of cereals.

Finally, the group is very close to their neighbours, Caritas. Until this year, Nasha Khata was reliant on Caritas for its water supply. In 2017, the group started work to dig its own well.

This has enabled the group to secure the long-term future of its work and to have greater peace of mind and work more effectively on the farm.

The European collectives

The European geographical collectives are important forums at which the groups can meet and discuss. They offer groups and members the chance to develop partnerships and build friendships. The collectives are also a good opportunity to discuss the groups' solidarity initiatives, the news and the socio-economic and political contexts in different countries. The geographical collectives cover Bosnia-Herzegovina, Romania and Poland-Ukraine.

These three working groups generate ideas while also implementing the initiatives chosen by Emmaus Europe. They are open to all activists in the Emmaus Movement from across the region.

Bosnia-Herzegovina Collective

The Bosnia-Herzegovina collective started discussions in 2017 with two Croatian associations that wish to join the Emmaus Movement. The Centre for Missing and Exploited Children took part in the November meeting and presented its work.



An exchange programme with the

Netherlands has been up and running for over a year and visits and stays in both countries took place in 2017. The visits and stays have proved very worthwhile as participants are able to see what life is really like at both ends of Europe.

The collective also had the chance to discuss relaunching the annual Bosnia -Herzegovina convoy project. In October 2017, a truck travelled from France, and the stakeholders involved want to continue and develop this initiative in 2018.

Finally, the Nova Generacija group informed the other members about a difficult situation. The activities of a former member are now placing the group in an irregular situation with the authorities. The Emmaus Europe Regional Executive has been approached about supporting the group.

Poland-Ukraine Collective

The Poland-Ukraine Collective has a large number of member groups and guest participants and last year focused on the groups' news and their solidarity programme initiatives. In addition to the three Polish groups and two Ukrainian groups, the collective welcomed representatives of the MPFSC (Lithuania), Amis3 and Smiltene (Latvia), and the Georgian association. These organisations were able to present their activities and the question now is how best to work with them and integrate them into the collective.



The collective meetings were also the chance to discuss the situations of Oselya (Ukraine) and Rzeszów (Poland). A mentor has been appointed for Emmaus Rzeszów and adjustments have been made to organisational procedures to secure the group's future.

Romania Collective

The Romania Collective was the chance to discuss group news and notably social reforms in the country. Specifically, the significant and rapid increase of the minimum wage constitutes very positive social progress but equally puts the Emmaus groups in a difficult position because their economic models were not designed for it.

The collective was also the chance to further develop the topic of the circular economy in conjunction with the discussions in the European institutions on the Circular Economy Package.

The Romanian institutions have been approached and discussions have been held with them at the various levels: the country's delegation in Brus-

sels, the president of the Romanian Parliament, the French embassy in Romania. One of Emmaus Europe's campaign areas is showcasing the role of social stakeholders in the circular economy and notably of all the Emmaus groups working on this subject in their day-to-day lives.



European transport programme

2017 saw 105 lorry loads of donated goods cross Europe.

These lorry loads are a vital source of goods for the groups whose economic contexts make it difficult for them to collect unwanted goods, and a way for sending groups to renew their stock, while also helping others. Moreover, they are often the chance for the groups involved to meet up and enjoy interacting with each other.

nual convoy of several trucks to Bosnia-Herzegovina every year. The geo-

graphical collective will be a good forum for making plans. The plan is to organise a convoy for 2018!

The French community of Emmaus Bougival has donated a truck to the European movement. Following an appeal to all the European groups, the regional executive decided to allocate the donation to Brat Albert in Poland.

A large number of groups have requested new trucks to help them run their projects.



And also...

A large number of other camps were also held in Europe, notably in France and Italy, but also in the UK and a second one in Finland.

The summer and youth camps are fantastic opportunities for young people from very different backgrounds to meet up. They enable them to rediscover or discover community life and chat to people from all over Europe. They also enable the Emmaus groups to introduce participants to their local regions and situations, and are a good chance to talk about the movement's founding values.

Regional sales with a European slant

The Nord Pas de Calais Region Salon (or big sale) in Picardy in France took place on 1 April 2017 in Lille. Several European groups took part, notably Germany and Romania. The lasi group was able to take away unsold items and sell them back home.

The 18th Emmaus Salon in Paris in support of international solidarity took place on 25 June 2017 and attracted 130 groups including 18 non-French European groups from Belgium, Finland, Italy, Netherlands, Romania, UK and Switzerland. 13,800 people visited the big sale, generating takings of €470,000. €75,000 was transferred to Emmaus International.

A one-off big sale took place in Turin on 14-15 October 2017 and was organised by all the Italian groups. Several French groups travelled to Italy for the event. 6,600 visitors made their way around the 7,000m² exhibition centre in Turin, generating a profit of €40,030, with slightly over €7,000 being transferred to Emmaus

Europe to support the solidarity programme initiatives.

A sale was also held in Krefeld on the same weekend as part of the group's 25th anniversary celebrations. Several German groups took part and Emmaus Germany generously decided to support the work of the MPFSC in Lithuania, donating €2,500 of the profit generated by the sale.

And to round off the year in style, the French groups from the Toulouse region held their fourth regional sale on 5 November 2017. Emmaus Europe had a stand at the event and took the chance to talk about European news and above all to meet up with the groups.

Thank you to everyone friends, volunteers, companions and employees - for their efforts at these solidarity events.





And finally...
