#### News from the Roanne Committee of Friends and state-aided contracts

The Roanne Committee of Friends is made up of volunteers and employees, the majority of whom are on state-aided contracts (known as CUI-CAE). The reduction in the number of state-aided contracts announced by the French government has put the group in an awkward position. The sub-prefect has confirmed that the committee is renowned for its work and it will not lose all of its state-aided contracts. The group should be able to replace the lost contracts with fixed-term employment contracts, at least in the short term. Local, national and international solidarity will doubtlessly suffer, with a drop of €100K likely in the coming financial year.

These contracts are very important for both the beneficiaries (integration and support) and the committee (maintaining its volume of business).

More generally, this situation raises the issue of the status of the people supported by Emmaus (companions, state-aided contracts etc), which needs to be addressed at European level.

#### Circular economy - initiatives undertaken and ideas for the future

#### 1. Background

In early 2016, Emmaus Europe met with the then president of the European Parliament, Martin Schulz, to discuss the issue of the circular economy. Emmaus Europe held a significant number of meetings with MEPs from the different committees over the course of the year, and several amendments to the Circular Economy Package were tabled.

In addition, in November Emmaus Europe published <u>The Emmaus groups in Europe - championing</u> <u>alternatives for a circular economy</u> booklet. The booklet showcases the groups' circular economy initiatives.

Advocacy continued to keep up the pressure about Emmaus Europe's amendments to the Circular Economy Package. The amendments were approved by the European Parliament on **14 March 2017**. Trilogue discussions about the waste directive are currently underway. 16 European countries out of the 28 Member States, representing 65% of Europe's population, need to be in favour of the package for it to be approved. The next phase will end on 25 October when a response will be announced. Emmaus Europe's strategy is to target the most heavily populated countries: Germany, France, Italy, Netherlands and Romania (Spain has already announced its support for the package). The states' current stances are listed in the attached document (*map page 36*).

Recently, Jean-Claude Juncker's mid-term review demonstrated a lack of political interest in Europe's social foundations.

#### 2. The circular economy in France

Emmaus has occupied a recycling niche in France to date. However, the EU has released funding to support the Member States in their transition and to encourage them to get to grips with the issue. This could well arouse fresh private sector interest in this potential goldmine and could mean that the Emmaus groups may face fierce competition. **Arrangements need to be made for Emmaus Europe to raise the groups' awareness about this issue.** 

#### 3. Strategy

It is important to re-emphasize the role played by the social and solidarity economy in the circular economy. The priority is to have recognized the role played in the circular economy by social stakeholders, such as Emmaus, and demonstrate the contribution made by these stakeholders in terms of sustainable development and solidarity to the circular economy as a whole.

Work is underway with RREUSE. Emmaus Europe has sent letters to the 28 Member States asking them to involve us in the discussions that affect social and solidarity economy organisations (since late 2016 and in June 2017). A shared RREUSE proposal – Emmaus Europe is a member – is also being put together to discuss the role played by social stakeholders.

4. Opportunities in Romania

Several ways of working on this topic in Romania were put forward:

- Contact the Romanian delegation COREPER (Committee of Permanent Representatives) in Brussels EE Secretariat.
- Contact the president of the Romanian Parliament Amicii d'Emmaus Târgu Jiu.
- Contact the French Embassy in Romania Un coup de main d'Emmaus Iasi.

The French embassy is currently looking to set up a circular economy project and it could be worthwhile for Emmaus Iasi to get in touch.

5. Questionnaire sent to the national delegates

During the summer a survey of Emmaus Europe's national delegates was run to find out about the legislative barriers encountered by the groups in their day-to-day activities. The findings are currently being put together and will take the form of a poster and leaflet, so that we can present the barriers encountered and the solutions devised by the groups.

#### 6. Status of the people supported by Emmaus in Europe

The focal point of discussions is the need for a recognized status for those supported by Emmaus (their situations currently differ, i.e. companions, state-aided contracts etc). A few examples

- Romania
  - No companion status, everyone is an employee, which makes it difficult for the groups because of the rapidly rising minimum wage.
  - Emmaus is prohibited from supporting people with mental health problems and alternatives to Emmaus are inadequate.
- France
  - No specific protection for the undocumented migrants supported by Emmaus, despite OACAS status (<u>http://emmaus72.fr/wp-content/uploads/2015/11/OACAS-</u> d%C3%A9pliant-externe-nov2015.pdf).
  - The companions are not entitled to unemployment benefit and the work is not recognized by some public services (visa applications).
- Germany
  - Companion allowance equivalent to the minimum wage in order not to generate additional vulnerability.

It seems that our social and solidarity economy objectives are rarely satisfactorily achieved, particularly because they do not fit well with the local legislative framework.

Recommendation: The idea was raised of developing an internal companion status charter in Europe so that we have a clear shared definition to convey to the outside world. It was proposed that a working group should be set up to progress this issue.

#### Article 13

A Crossing the Straits of Gibraltar (swimming and kayaking) event was arranged last year. It was repeated this year with the community branch of Emmaus France. The initiative sought to highlight the dangers faced by the migrants who cross the Mediterranean and the reception they receive on arrival. The weather conditions prevented the crossing from taking place and the programme had to be altered.

A meeting was held between the mayor of Tarifa, the president of Emmaus France, the chair of Emmaus International and the mayor of Grande-Synthe. The participants then visited the cemetery where those who perish at sea are buried, before silently making their way down to the beach where an open door had been symbolically placed. The swimmers and kayakers then put to sea, making their way along the coast.
