Every year, Emmaus Europe launches a call for projects run by the European groups who need a helping hand to develop or maintain their initiatives. The selected projects are then put forward to the other groups, and they provide funding for them. Find out about the projects submitted for support in 2021.

ANOTHER UNUSUAL YEAR FOR SOLIDARITY

Following a year without a European solidarity programme so that we could fully focus our efforts on solidarity with the other regions of the world, the Emmaus Europe governing bodies relaunched a call for projects developed by the European groups in November 2020. The executive and then the regional council scrutinized, discussed and approved the initiatives, starting in early 2021, and rubberstamping them on 27 April 2021.

However, unlike other years, the European elected representatives asked the groups to limit their applications to urgent projects

in order to be able to once again channel most of European solidarity to the groups in the other regions of the world, and take into account the fact that all the groups will still be experiencing uncertainty over the coming months. However, the European elected representatives nevertheless wanted to maintain this strong link between the continent's groups and enable projects to be developed to adapt to new circumstances or simply continue with the groups' essential work. In Croatia: CNZD A MULTIMEDIA STUDIO



Founded in 2006, the Centre for Missing and Exploited Children (CNZD) works to protect children and young people against all forms of abuse, particularly sexual abuse. The association runs six day centres and arranges language lessons and homework support sessions. CNZD has also launched the country's first hotline for reporting violence against children, has a national child protection refuge, and supports the Roma community in monitoring children's learning achievement.

The initiative

The group had to close its second-hand store because of the pandemic. Deprived of its main income-generating activity, CNZD started to offer digital services to businesses in its local area, making use of the group's digital communication and new technologies skillset. The group now wants to secure the long-term future of this activity by creating a multimedia studio, which will help support its many social initiatives.

Rollout

The studio requires initial investment for purchasing the hardware (particularly computers) and the software required. Solidarity funding will also enable the studio's two employees to be paid in the first year, until the studio becomes self-supporting, and then generates a profit to cover the other activities. The studio will offer services such as web development, graphic design, video production, and digital communication tools.



In Croatie: TOMS AN ELECTRIC CARGO SCOOTER



TOMS Association for People with Physical Disabilities (Trogir-Okrug-Marina-Seget) was founded over 30

years ago by people with disabilities to work on general access issues: access to public spaces, to communications and information, services, work, and rehabilitation communities. People with learning difficulties or physical disabilities are the main stakeholders in the association's many projects.

The initiative

TOMS opened a social restaurant in Trogir in Southern Croatia in June 2020. The restaurant provides employment for people with disabilities, serves free meals to needy people, and is a new income-generating activity in the drive to make the **This cargo scooter** is needed so that the social restarant can offer deliveries.

group self-supporting. The intention is to develop home deliveries to consolidate the business and adapt to the pandemic.

Rollout

TOMS will be able to buy an electric delivery scooter with this funding support. The scooter will be used to make home or workplace deliveries across Trogir, including in areas that are inaccessible to cars. The income-generating activity will also create an extra part-time (and potentially more) job.



<u>In Poland:</u> Emmaus Brat Albert

A NEW VAN



The new van is vital for collections and deliveries, and for community outreach work.

> Funding needed = 15 000€

Emmaus Brat Albert joined the

movement in 2003. The group comprises two residential and working communities in Krakow and Nowy Sacz in Southern Poland. The group undertakes the classic Emmaus community activities (collecting, sorting, repairing and selling second-hand goods), and does a lot of work with the homeless. In practice, this means that Emmaus Brat Albert manages emergency shelters and a food bank, and does regular outreach work.

The initiative

The group's work involves a lot of travel, whether for collections, deliveries, or the outreach work. Unfortunately, the association's current second-hand van, which was obtained thanks to solidarity from another Emmaus group, is coming to the end of its life, and is requiring more and more frequent and costly repairs. Emmaus Brat Albert therefore wants to purchase a new vehicle to carry out its work.

Rollout

The funding will enable the group to buy a new van. This will significantly improve the companions' working conditions, and will enable substantial savings over the next few years.

SOLIDARITY IN ALL OF ITS FORMS

Our solidarity is also and primarily intangible!

One of the cornerstones of the Emmaus movement is our members meeting and interacting. However, resources are required to fund these gatherings.

The European geographical collectives

There are three geographical collectives (South-East Europe, Poland-Ukraine, and Romania) and their stated aim is to organise solidarity with the region's groups, welcome and support new movement members, foster people getting together, and support the structuring of Emmaus and recognition of the movement in the relevant areas, etc. Each geographical collective meets once a year.

Themed meetings

The members who attended the 2019 EE regional assembly stressed the importance of developing exchanges between groups across the region. The themed meetings aim to address this collective wish by offering forums for exchanging practices, sharing experiences, and mutual training on topics linked to the everyday work of the groups and their shared goals. Several meetings are arranged every year, on topics as diverse as textiles, youth, and online sales.

Training

The Emmaus in all of its facets training course is open to all the groups and to everyone involved in the movement. The course enables to discover the history and diversity of the movement, and meet and chat with participants from all over Europe.
