## **Presentation of statutory and regulatory amendments**

These proposed changes are being put forward to address the nine requirements listed below.

Additions are underlined and deletions are crossed out in the "amended article/rule" column below.

The previous versions of the statutes and the versions put to the vote are available online on the members' area of the emmaus-europe.org website.

The **articles** refer to the statutes and the **rules** to the internal regulations.

1. Inclusion of the fight against gender discrimination in the list of forms of discrimination to which Emmaus Europe is committed.

Beforehand, a regional electoral assembly elects the incumbent Councillors of Emmaus International and the substitute Councillors of Emmaus International at the earliest six months before and at the latest on the eve of the World Assembly.  Another regional assembly may be held at any time if so decided by the regional council. They are elected at electoral regional assemblies and take up their positions at the World Assembly following their election. that they become replacements. Each of the region's member organisations is only allowed to submit one candidate for election. Only the incumbent CEIs are full members of the regional council. The replacement CEIs only receive the regional council's working documents. If the period of office of a CEI ends between two General World Assemblies for the reasons listed in Article 30, the regional council calls as a replacement, for the rest of the period of of-fice, the replacement candidate who received the most votes at the regional assembly. This replacement CEI will be called to serve in the order of election, provided that there are no more than four CEIs in total from the same country. If this is the case, the next replacement candidate will be called to replace the candidate who is unable to continue. The EE president will decide which replacement candidate to call if the votes are tied. <u>If they are no replacement</u> candidates, the regional council may, as a last resort, call on the groups to put forward new candidates who will be elected by the regional council.
